Screens in the Wild



'Screens in the Wild' is a collaborative project initiated by researchers from University College London, University of Nottingham, the London Borough of Waltham Forest and the E11BID Company. The screen is located at the ground floor of the Leytonstone Library building next to the Church Lane entrance. It will initially be used to promote local news and events.

Our screen in Leytonstone is linked to other screens based in Walthamstow and Nottingham. They will be used to broadcast media and interactive technologies to enhance real world connections, add value to the daily experience of the urban environment, and foster community participation and ownership of the urban space. Local businesses, organisations and residents are involved as key partners in the creative development process.





Olympics Travel Advice



Transport for London (TfL) has today launched an online 'Temporary Road Changes' planning tool, enabling London's road users to see how the areas where they live, work and visit will be affected, searchable by postcode.

The tool is available at www.getaheadofthegames.com

The new 'Temporary Road Changes' tool currently includes information about the Olympic and Paralympic Route Networks (ORN/PRN) and the Road Event routes in London. More information, including traffic management around the Road Events routes and venues, will be added to the 'Temporary Road Changes' tool in early June. The A12 which runs along Leytonstone is part of the Olympic and Paralympic Route Networks. Traffic in and around our town centre

will be affected so it is important you plan in advance deliveries, opening hours and accessibility for your staff. In launching the planning tool, TfL would like to remind road users that, as it is turned into a massive sporting and cultural venue, roads in central London and around Games venues - the 'hotspot' locations -will be much busier than usual. TfL's Key Advice for Motorists

- Motorists should avoid central London and around the ORN and venues during Games time
- Motorists should also avoid the areas around the 2012 Games road event courses on competition days
- Every day of the Games is different so if driving is essential, plan ahead and allow more time

A Freight Journey Planner tool will be launched by TfL in early June, incorporating all of the road impacts to assist freight operators with their planning. TfL has been working with the freight industry since last year on advice and plans for them to operate as normal as possible during the Games.

Business Olympic Advice



The London Borough of Waltham Forest are arranging a series of drop - in sessions and workshops, for local businesses in preparation of the London 2012 Olympic games.

The details of these sessions are as follows:

- Walthamstow Library: Wednesday 13th June, 2pm to 4pm (drop-in session)
- Waltham Forest College: Uplands House, 1 Uplands Business Park, Blackhorse Lane, Walthamstow, London E17 5QJ. **Friday 15th June**, 10.00am to midday. (This will be a more intensive 'workshop' session targeting larger firms, who may have more extensive transportation and freight movement needs)

The aim of these sessions is to:

- 1. Provide businesses with an opportunity to ask any final / outstanding questions regarding Games Time activity
- 2. Highlight the traffic movements proposed for the borough (both in terms of local traffic movements, and impact of traffic movements within the neighbouring boroughs and across London)
- 2. Clarify the process of applying / receiving Parking Permits for the Controlled Parking Zones earmarked in the borough
- 3. Refer to further assistance available for larger firms in terms of preparing for the games.
- 4. Provide advice for businesses in terms of preparing their business for games time activity (ie; freight and delivery; working with suppliers etc...)
